By air.

Pulkovo (LED) is the only international airport in St. Petersburg.

By ferry.

Today is no ferry to Saint-Petersburg. We wait opening new lines on Summer 2009.

There's ferry from Lappeenranta, Finland to Vyborg, Russia on Summer (15.5.-1.9.2009). One way ticket 43EUR. See:

Today is no ferry to Pskov, Russia from Estonia by Peipsi(Chudskoe) lake.

NB: On autumn a new russia migration law take in force. Duo to that law every foreign traveller, who goes to Russia by ferry (not only by cruise boat) can entry without russian visa (not longer 72 hours), if he/she arrives via "special port". Listing of "special ports" is making now in Government of Russia. Saint-Petersburg will be in this list obligatory.

By yacht.

There are several special yacht-cumstoms point in Russia on Finnish gulf and Peipsi(Chudskoe) lake. Look for infos in yacht-oriented sites ;)

By train.

There are three daily trains connecting Helsinki and St. Petersburg, one of them proceeding to Moscow.
